

#### International Women's Day Spotlight-

#### Claudia Goldin

Claudia Goldin is a Professor of Economics at Harvard University and in the 1980s she was the first to develop a comprehensive approach to explaining the source of differences in pay between men and women.

In 2023, Goldin won a Nobel Prize thanks to her research examining history of the gender pay gap. Goldin's research has helped the world better understand current, past and future labour markets and the role of married women in these markets.





# **Techognition Day**

Today is also Techognition Day, a one-day event celebrates the work of school and FE college technicians (science, DT, food, art, music, drama, IT) with the aim of publicly showcasing their vast range of skills and the variety of tasks that these jobs entail.

#### Ms Chambers—Art Technician

Ms Chambers is another long standing member of staff at King's having started at school in 2017. Ms Chambers role has been incredibly varies and she has taken on a variety of tasks within the school during her time here. Ms Chambers has helped as a Site Assistant and an Invigilator, as well as her current role of Art Technician. # **Operating Theatre Live**


