Ethos

At the beginning of this new term, we have been thinking about our school values and specifically exploring what we mean by **Love** with staff and students. In the Bible there are different words to describe different kinds of love. Our core value of Love is what the Bible refers to as Agape. Agape is the love of God for His people and the corresponding love that Christians have for other people. Whereas our common notion of love is emotional, the focus of Agape love is an act of the will. It is not just about feeling, it is action. Love, in this Christian sense, should be self-sacrificial, generous, unconditional and boundless. This love is seen most clearly in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Paul's description of Love in his first letter to the church in Corinth reminds us of what it looks like to live out this kind of love day to day. Please pray for our school community as we seek to love one another in this way, as Christ loves us.

Love is **patient**, love is **kind**, it is **not envious**. Love **does not brag**, it is **not puffed up**. It is **not rude**, it is **not self-serving**, it is **not easily angered** or **resentful**. It is **not glad about injustice**, but **rejoices in the truth**. It **bears** all things, **believes** all things, **hopes** all things, **endures** all things.

Rewards and Consequences

Rewards and consequences will all now be recorded on Bromcom and pupils and parents can monitor these through their new logins. This year one of our key priorities is to work with pupils and staff to develop a brand new rewards system that motivates all our learners and ensures we can recognize achievements in all areas of school life. We very much look forward to sharing the outcomes of this work with you later in the academic year.

Behaviour at King's is usually excellent and OFSTED recently recognized it as 'exemplary'. However, inevitably there are times when pupils need to be given a consequence for behaviour which is contrary to our school ethos and disrupts learning. All staff have been trained to follow a clear consequences ladder start with verbal reminders. For the vast majority of pupils a verbal reminder (C1) or a short 10mins detention at lunch, or at the end of the school day, (C2) will be sufficient to address any behavioural concerns. Staff will use this time to have a constructive conversation with pupils and re-set expectations. For more serious or persistently poor behaviour, pupils may be given a Friday afternoon Senior Leadership Detention (C3) or may require a period of isolation away from peers (C4 or C5). We always try to avoid suspension, but there are occasions when it is appropriate for pupils to be removed from the school for a number of days to reflect on their actions (C6). The reasons why we may choose to suspend are set out in the school's Behaviour Policy.

C1 - Verbal or written reminder

C2 - 10mins detention either at lunchtime or after-school

C3 - SLT detention of either 30mins, 60mins or 120mins on Friday afternoon

C4 - Internal isolation of six periods, usually lessons 1-6

C5 - Internal isolation from 1pm to 5pm for serious behavioural incidents

C6 - Suspension from school

Attendance and Lateness

As a community we should be very proud of our attendance record, with pupils in all years showing tremendous resilience and fortitude throughout the period of the pandemic. This year we will once again have a challenging attendance target of 96% and will be encouraging all pupils to meet or exceed this. We will regularly reflect on attendance in tutor time and ensure all pupils who have good attendance are recognized and rewarded. Please see the recent letter from Mr Chamberlain for more details about attendance.

This year we will no longer be issuing daily detentions for morning lateness. Instead, form tutors will monitor and record the times pupils arrive to their tutor room. If a pupil is late on two or more occasions, without a valid reason, or there is a pattern of lateness, they will be placed in a 30mins C3 detention on Friday. Tutors will also be in contact with you as parents and carers to discuss any punctuality concerns. If there are any reasons why your child may be regularly late to school, please ensure their form tutor is aware of the issue.

Uniform

We have not made any changes to the school uniform and all staff will continue to encourage the pupils to wear their uniform well and look smart throughout the whole school day. Uniform checks will be carried out during tutor times and it will be possible to temporarily lend items of missing or damaged uniform from our lending facility. Homework

As we begin the school year we will be talking to students about the importance of their learning, both in the classroom and outside of it. As part of this, we will be emphasising the importance of engaging with and completing home learning (homework) tasks.

The intention of our curriculum is to teach our students to become **wise**. We want our students to be able to make wise choices and to live wisely, both inside and outside school. Wisdom is more than gaining knowledge, it is being able to apply understanding to a

situation. Home learning provides an opportunity for us to help our students to develop wisdom, through setting **regular, relevant** tasks which are **reviewed**.

What will home learning look like for our students?

At KS3 pupils will be set home learning tasks, in line with department home learning plans, weekly. Home learning tasks should take approximately 30 minutes per subject set, per week. By year 9 pupils may receive up to 60 minutes per subject per week in core subjects.

Year 7 students will be set optional home learning tasks in the first half term, compulsory core and optional tasks in other subjects in the second half term and a full home learning timetable after the Christmas break.

At KS4 pupils will be set home learning tasks as deemed appropriate by teachers, with a minimum of one piece per subject per week. Home learning tasks should take approximately one hour per subject, per week. At KS4 there is an increasing emphasis on developing independence in study. Students will need to combine home learning tasks set by their teachers with their own independent revision and study.

Where can your child view their home learning tasks?

All home learning tasks will be set on Bromcom, and are viewable by students and parents via the Bromcom parent and student apps.

More detailed information will follow home separately about how we will be monitoring and reporting on engagement with home learning this year.

EMOTIONAL

(motivating, keeping safe, spending time with, keeping company, making feel wanted/needed)



PERSONAL

(all aspects of dressing, washing, toileting, feeding, other tasks such as hair brushing, make up, shaving etc.)
