


Headteacher's Update

Final Day of Term

Our final day of term is Thursday 15th December. In line with previous final days of term, the day will run differently to a normal school day. The school will follow an amended timetable for the day as follows:

- All students to arrive at school for 8:30am as normal in full school uniform;
- KS3 students (Year 7, 8 and 9) will be dismissed from school at 12:25pm;
- KS4 students (Year 10 and 11) will be dismissed from school at 12:30pm.

Students will have tutor time, lessons, and a celebration assembly during the morning. All students will also have an extended, 30 minute brunch in place of their usual breaktime and students in receipt of free school meals will be able to spend their allowance on hot food during this time. Please be mindful that bus times will not be amended to reflect the change to the end of the day, and therefore students are encouraged to look up alternative bus timetables prior to the 15th December. All students should return to school for an 8:30am start as usual on Wednesday 4th January 2023. Please note that Tuesday 3rd January is an INSET day and the school will be closed to all students on this date.

Carol Service

This year we will be holding Carol Services on the afternoon of Wednesday 7th December at Bishop Hannington Church. Students will be walked from school to the church to attend a service and will be dismissed from the church. Alternative transport will be made for those unable to walk to the church. Further information on this will follow in a letter next week. Due to the capacity of the church, we are unable to welcome parents to these services this year. Please see Mrs Vincent's recent letter for further details.

Enrichment Day

Next Friday (9th December) is our first enrichment day of this academic year and all students will be off timetable completing alternative activities.

Year 7 Weald and Downland Museum

Students going on the trip should be at school for 8.15am in full school uniform and should go the canteen to be registered. Students will need a packed lunch and will require a warm coat and sensible shoes as they will spend much of the day outside and it is due to be cold. The trip is due to arrive back at school for approximately 15.15. Please see the trip letter for specific details of the day.

Year 7 Dickens Christmas

Students should arrive at school for 9.00am in full school uniform. The students will be working in the English department where they will be completing a range of fun activities. Please note that the school day ends at 2.30pm on this date for those in school.

Year 8 Forensics

All Year 8 students will be completing a forensics day in the Science department. The students should arrive at school at 9.00am in full school uniform. They will be working in their tutor groups in the science labs completing a range of activities to slowly solve a crime! Please note that the school day ends at 2.30pm on this date for those in school.

Year 9 Careers

Students in Year 9 will be taking part in a careers day. It is an important time for Year 9 as they start thinking about their options for GCSE and beyond and we hope that the sessions will support them in making the right choice. Students should be in school for 9.00am in full school uniform. They will take part in a workshop in the morning where they will meet a number of people from a range of careers who will share they education and career paths to date. They will also complete an enterprise task and spend time finding out about careers on Unifrog. Please note that the school day ends at 2.30pm on this date for those in school.

Year 10 Options

Year 10 will be completing a range of activities based on their options. Activities range from a GCSE History revision day at Hampton Court to specific art and food

sessions in school. Students will be informed of their option and any requirements in advance of the day.

Students who are going on the Hampton Court trip should arrive at school for 7.45am. Please see the trip letter for specific details of the day. They should wear full school uniform but will need a warm coat and sensible shoes as they are required to spend some time outdoors. These students will leave Hampton Court by 13.00 and should arrive back by approximately 3.15. Please note that, for students not going on the trip, the school day ends at 2.30pm.

Year 11 Revision and Wellbeing

Year 11 will start their day completing the "Ace Your Exams" session with the award winning Elevate group. Last year's Year 11 found this session invaluable and we hope the current year group will get just as much out of the day. After break students will make two choices from a rage of wellbeing themed activities ranging from Circuit training to Christmas crafts. Year 11 should find this an informative and fun day. Students should be in full school uniform and arrive at school for 9.00. Please note that the school day ends at 2.30pm.

Sixth Form Opening


The Sixth Form at King's will be opening in September 2023 and will accept both King's students and students from other local schools.

Revision Tip – Elaboration

This week's revision tip builds on what we were looking at last week - writing up notes. Elaboration is an important feature in extending our responses. Elaboration comes from the Latin 'ex' meaning 'out' and 'laborare' meaning 'to work, labour or struggle' as in 'to work out in great detail'. Elaboration is showing understanding of a topic by answering 'how' and 'why' questions.

Below are some sentence stems students could use to practise this:

- How does X work?
- Why does X happen?
- Why does it make sense that _____?
- Why is this true?

- Why is X true and not Y?
- When did X happen?
- What caused X?
- What is the result of X?

This is also a great strategy that students can use to practise self-explaining as they answer these questions. If they explain them to a partner, they would be teaching – another very effective revision tool.

Sporting Success

Last week, a team of students from King's competed in the Royal Society of Chemistry's 'Top of the Bench' competition. The event took place at Brighton College and our team were competing against nine other schools from the Sussex area. Our students had to complete a challenging practical activity and a multiple choice quiz in timed conditions. They completed both activities calmly and competently and I was impressed with their resilient attitudes. Even though they weren't the eventual winners, our students thoroughly enjoyed the experience.





Safety and wellbeing: Vaping

We continue to receive reports from substance misuse agencies in the city and the NHS regarding the rapid rise in the use of vaping devices by young people. As a school, we have also experienced a rise in the number of pupils using vapes and wanted to write to you to outline our position on this matter.

Vaping products are now widely available on the high street but can also be purchased online through social media apps. Selling vaping products to anyone aged under 18 in shops is illegal. Please be aware that vapes are widely available to young people, even though this is strictly against the law. In addition, there are now significant numbers of counterfeit products and these contain very high quantities of nicotine with 1 in 5 young people experiencing nicotine addiction. The World Health Organisation have consistently reported that vaping and e-cigarettes are harmful and you can read more about their findings in the link below.

As a school we do not recommend that any young person vapes. It is strictly against the school rules to vape on the school site or bring any vaping products into school. If we suspect that a pupil has vaping products with them, we will use the school's Searching, Screening and Confiscation Procedure to search bags and pockets. If vaping products are found your child will receive a serious consequence.

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
