Sussex Police (Brighton Youth Team)

As part of our PSHE curriculum, it is our aim to ensure that all students gain valuable information around online safety, within and outside of our PSHE lessons. This week we welcomed visits from Sussex Police (Brighton Youth Team), who delivered specific online

safety workshops to our Year 8 cohort. The sessions are tailored to provide age-appropriate information around online etiquette, specifically around individual safety when interacting with others online. Sussex Police Youth Team share key facts around the law and set up a workshop environment, which allows students to interact with one another, share feedback in a safe space and gain advice from our external professionals. The Year 8's who were involved this week demonstrated great maturity when sharing feedback, interacted brilliantly with our external visitors and for many, if not all, took some new information away from the session. Throughout the academic year, each year group will receive similar workshops from Sussex Police, continuing with the theme of online safety.
