Year 11

GCSE exams then start on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> May and all students have received an exam timetable, an exams' handbook and a timetable for school lessons for the two weeks of exams before the half term break.

- Students are expected in school every day in the two weeks preceding half term at the normal time whether or not they have an exam.
- Every day the LRC will be open for quiet study before school from 8am and, at 8:30, the teachers of the subject of the morning exam will come and do a pre-exam briefing to get students ready and focused for the exam.
- If students do not have an exam in the morning, they should go to their tutor room as normal at 8:30am.
- There will be normal lessons when exams aren't on – which are great opportunities for targeted revision.
- When there is an exam in the afternoon there will also be a revision session during periods 3 and 4 to ensure students are ready for the afternoon.
- We will run period 7 lessons that are optional during the exam period. These will be for the exams on the following day.

The timetable for these two weeks is attached.

There will be some intervention sessions during the half term break (there are GCSE exams for the two weeks before this break and the three weeks after). Invitations will go out the week beginning the 15<sup>th</sup> May. The dates and subjects are:

- Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> May Maths
- Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> June Music / Geography / English / Science
- Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> June History

These are by invitation only and most students will be asked to revise independently at home. If you feel your son or daughter should be attending one of these, then please email the subjects directly using the subject

#### Knives in schools

We receive frequent briefings and guidance from Sussex Police regarding the prevalence and use of knives amongst young people in the city. We have been



proactive at King's in inviting the police into school to talk to our pupils about this issue so they feel informed and fully aware of laws.

As a school we maintain a zero tolerance approach to the carrying of knives or any offensive weapons. We would particularly like to draw your attention to the following 'training knives' which are freely available online. These training knives are treated as offensive weapons and should never be carried in public or brought into school.

The Police frequently brief schools and have made it clear that any young person carrying a knife in Brighton will receive a caution.
