


Theme of the Week: Wisdom for Life – Two Sons – Matthew 21:28-32


Brighton Girls' Maths picnic, organized by AMSP

Brighton Girls did a great job hosting this year's Maths picnic. It was really fun to get challenged by the problem-solving questions that we wouldn't normally do. As we came in there was a small starter task to get us going which helped acclimatize us to the oncoming Maths problems, also the refreshments were delicious. After all schools had arrived, we got started on a crossword involving different equations to complete. We had a good amount of time and enjoyed the crossword, as it wasn't too hard to start with and we hadn't done anything like it before. Once the time was up, we moved on to the next task, which was to do with fractions and percentages, this was more difficult, but the timings were perfect for the work we needed to do. We got to try different questions that we could do when playing with fractions and had lots of fun solving the tasks. Throughout the whole day we were greeted with kindness from not only the hosts of Brighton Girls but also the students who helped us find our way around the building and supplied us with all we could needed to have a truly enjoyable day. Before the interval where we got to enjoy their array of their tasty pastries and juices, we had a go at a countdown challenge where we had to find equations for a set answer using numbers given to us. 'countdown' was a 1-minute task and there were 4 in total, this was a nice change from the problems that took a longer amount of time such as 12-minute ones, we enjoyed this as it was a quick burst of problem solving.

After we used the clean facilities provided, we got started on a shape puzzle where we used a set of cards to solve what and where shapes went in a cross grid. This task was more challenging than the previous tasks, but we did the best we could and managed to get a reasonable score, although we thoroughly enjoyed this task as the teamwork aspect consistently ran through the whole task and we worked together seamlessly. Once we finished the cross grid, we had a go at a worksheet where you are given an equation for a and b and you must work out if a and b are $a > b$, $a < b$, $a = b$. overall, our whole team thoroughly enjoyed the

experience and would love to have another go next year. Thank you for hosting we had a great time.

Women's FA Cup Final

The sun was shining on Wembley Stadium and women's football in general. Many of our KS3 girls football players and their families had the opportunity to join the record crowd of 77,390 fans watch Manchester United battle Chelsea in the Women's FA Cup final on Sunday.

The day saw a close contest between the two sides. A Chelsea side full of injuries and tiredness due to being in the last stages of all competitions this year were fighting for their third consecutive FA Cup win. A United side full of vigour and enthusiasm looking for their first win in their first ever FA Cup final.

United came out strong in the first half, with an extremely early goal disallowed for off-side. Chelsea absorbed the pressure well, with a great save from Ann-Katrin Berger keeping United at bay. Chelsea struggled to build a continuous attack due to the will and determination of the United players.

Whatever Emma Hayes (Chelsea manager) said to her players at half-time clearly worked, as the Chelsea players came out renewed and on the attack. With Sam Kerr, the Australian International and FWA Player of the year, getting on the end of a pass from Pernille Harder to slot the ball past Mary Earps and into the back of the Manchester United net. Despite more chances at either end and an incredible last ditch effort by United the game remained 1-0 with Chelsea retaining the trophy.

Our attending students were heard to remark on how impressive the stadium was, and that the atmosphere was incredible. Nia J, our under 14 goal keeper, was so pleased that her favourite team, Chelsea, won for the 3rd year in a row. Her screams of joy could be heard as

they lifted the trophy, handed to them by HRH Prince William of Wales.

Catch action from United and Chelsea over the weekend, as, with 2 games left to play, they are both still hoping to take the top spot in the Women's Super League. Chelsea have Arsenal at home this weekend, United take on Manchester City. Then next weekend Chelsea are away to Reading and United travel to Liverpool.


You can catch both games on TV this Sunday:
