

#### Head Student – Sixth Form


Congratulations to Miryam M, who has been elected as our Head Student for the Sixth Form this year. Please read a statement from Miriyam below:

#### **Road Safety**

This week we were delighted to be joined by the Sussex Safer Roads Partnership who led drama workshops for Year 7 and 11 to raise awareness of road safety. These were excellent sessions where pupils were given advice on how to staff safe and be noticed. The key points were:

- Stick to pavements and known routes
- Wear bright clothing and be visible
- Identify and avoid risks
- Use crossings wherever possible
- Never allow mobile phones to be a distraction when crossing
- Remove earphones and hoods when crossing roads

#### Child Criminal Exploitation and County Lines

The school receives frequent briefings from the police regarding Child Criminal Exploitation and County Lines. This remains a significant issue in Brighton and Hove and is covered in our Year 9 PSHE curriculum. We feel it is important to regularly share this information with parents, particularly the signs of exploitation.

Criminal exploitation is child abuse where children and young people are manipulated and coerced into committing crimes. County Lines is the police term for urban gangs exploiting young people into moving drugs from a hub, normally a large city, into suburban areas and market and coastal towns - using dedicated mobile phone lines or "deal lines". Children as young as 12 years old have been exploited into carrying drugs for gangs. This can involve children being trafficked away from their home area, staying in accommodation and selling and manufacturing drugs. Sussex Police produced a video which outlines the seriousness of the issue in Brighton and Hove and you can view it by <u>clicking here</u>.

What are the signs a young person is being exploited?

• Frequently absent from and doing badly in school.

- Going missing from home, staying out late and travelling for unexplained reasons.
- In a relationship or hanging out with someone older than them.
- Being angry, aggressive or violent.
- Being isolated or withdrawn.
- Having unexplained money and buying new things.
- Wearing clothes or accessories in gang colours or getting tattoos.
- Using new slang words.
- Spending more time on social media and being secretive about time online.
- Making more calls or sending more texts, possibly on a new phone or phones.
- Self-harming and feeling emotionally unwell.
- Taking drugs and abusing alcohol.
- Committing petty crimes like shop lifting or vandalism.
- Unexplained injuries and refusing to seek medical help.
- Carrying weapons or having a dangerous breed of dog.

If you suspect a young person is involved in CCE or County Lines you should call the police immediately. They have teams dedicated to supporting young people who have been drawn into these issues.

#### **Black History Month**

The focus for Black History Month this year is on Saluting our Sisters, highlighting black women both in history and today. This week, we wanted to highlight Dr Maggie Aderin-Pocock, who is a British space scientist, science educator and science communicator. Dr Aderin-Pocock is an advocate for diversity and inclusion in STEM fields and wants to encourage more young people from diverse backgrounds to consider a career in STEM. In 2009, Dr Maggie received an MBE and was the first

black woman to win a gold medal in the Physics News Award.

#### November Monthly Outreach Lecture Wednesday 1 November 2023

More than 900,000 people live with a diagnosis of dementia in the UK, and most people will require a range of health and social care during their lives. To ensure healthcare professionals have the right skills, knowledge, and attitudes to support people with dementia, good quality education needs to be provided at undergraduate level. The Time for Dementia programme was designed at BSMS to meet that aim and help future generations of healthcare professionals learn about the real-life experiences of living with dementia.

In November's monthly lecture, Yvonne Feeney will provide a background about dementia and discuss the learning experiences for students taking part in the Time for Dementia programme. Yvonne is the Project Manager for Time for Dementia at BSMS and is also completing a PhD that aims to understand how empathy develops in healthcare students towards people with dementia. Yvonne is an adult nurse and has worked with people with dementia for most of her career. This event will be running via the Zoom platform from 6:30pm – 7:30pm.

#### **Online Medicine Talks**

Please note, this session will discuss topics of a potentially sensitive nature including cancer and death. This talk is suitable for people aged 15+

This session provides an overview of the application process for applying to medical school.

#### Tuesday 7 November – Student Life at Medical School – 5pm-6.30pm

This session showcases some of our current undergraduate medicine students from across different year groups, with plenty of time allocated for attendees to ask students questions about their experiences.
